Greetings from your Pastor

Alleluia, Christ is risen! He is risen indeed! Alleluia!

This Easter season, we are reminded of both the power and promise of the resurrection. The story of the resurrection reminds us of God's power to transform evil into goodness, and to create something new out of destruction. This is an important reminder for us as people of faith, to be encouraged knowing that God can always bring something new, something right, dare I say something good out of the depths. When we believe in the resurrection, we are not just believing in a story. We are believing in a promise that we too can experience new life.

We most often find ourselves needing this reminder of a promise for transformed life and renewed hope in our daily work of social justice. There are endless places in our world where violence rages, human rights & dignity are violated, hunger persists, and oppression reigns. In fact, there are so many that if I were to begin listing them, we would run out of space and something would inevitably be forgotten. However, as I write this letter my heart is drawn to our sister synod of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Jordan and the Holy Land - to our siblings of all faiths trying to survive the continued conflict and increasing violence of the Israel - Palestine conflict.

In 1989, the ELCA approved a social message that spoke to the situation. And while it is currently outdated as far as containing any specifics on current

genocide, violence and destruction, the guidance for our faith remains the same. The ELCA as a church, and as a faithful people had been silent on this in previous generations, so it is especially important not to remain silent today. "We must speak about the human rights abuses in the Occupied Territories today, especially amid the rapidly changing developments in the Middle East. Our faith calls us to stand with all who suffer, whatever their religious conviction or cultural identity.... We speak because of our faith in God, the bringer of peace. Called to serve this God, the ELCA is constitutionally mandated to participate in God's mission by '... advocating dignity and justice for all people, [and] working for peace and reconciliation among the nations.' (ELCA, 4.02)" (section I) As you continue to read the social message in full, it goes on to call for an immediate "cessation of human rights abuses against the Palestinians because of the Israeli occupation" (section II), and acknowledges the complexity of history in the land, between religions, and among political goals.

We are a church, we are Christians, we are a people of faith. We are not a political power able to negotiate the details of peace between governments. But this does not mean that silence is a faithful response. We are still called by scripture and our constitution to stand with all who suffer and advocate for justice. We need to be aware of the cries of suffering around the world and especially those in Gaza right now. The social message of the Israeli/Palestinian Conflict can be found on the ELCA website, (<u>https://elca.org/Faith/Faith-and-Society/Social-Messages</u>) or printed in the church vestry/hall. I encourage everybody to read this if you haven't done so already. When you do, you will notice in the final section it challenges us to do the following:

"We urge members of the ELCA to:

A. familiarize themselves with the history of the Middle East and current issues affecting the conflict so that they can be advocates for responsible political action; and

B. pray for the coming of God's gift of peace in this area so that Christians, Muslims and Jews might live lives free from violence and fear." (section 5)

I hope you join me in praying for peace and resurrection in Gaza. Let us pray for killing, hunger, injustice, and oppression to cease. Let us pray for God to be a source of courage for those who live in fear, a companion for those who have lost everything, a source of comfort for those in grief, a source of healing for those in pain, and a source of peace to Israel and Palestine. May the God of resurrection transform this land into one of life, safety, joy and prosperity and may God bring new life in the midst of turmoil.

Social Ministry

Father Bill's Shelter: We received a report from Larry Johnson, who told us that things have been going well so far this year. The freezer is fully resourced, and Larry is working with Maura to set up a Restaurant Depot account. A team of about six folks regularly meet on the fourth Tuesday of each month to prepare turkey pies for the shelter's residents. Come help on March 26th, 1 pm.

Neighbors at the Table: Our ministry has been going well this year, with the house looking forward to our visits and actively engaged around the tables as we socialize. We had a request for cereal last time. Maybe they don't like my scrambled eggs?

Interfaith Social Services Food Pantry: We will have our next quarterly food drive on Sunday May 5th. We will post the grocery list. People will be welcome to bring food items.

Imagine all the Swedish meatballs, Italian lasagna, Irish soda bread, & Mexican salsa...What nation will win this Olympic game? Pre-Identification Form now closed

The pre-identification form is now closed for those individuals interested in offering the name of a rostered minister of Word and Sacrament (a pastor) in the ELCA for consideration for call to be elected Bishop of the New England Synod. Any pastor in good standing on the ELCA roster in the United States is eligible to be named.

Individuals whose names were provided were contacted to determine if they'd like to discern a call to bishop, and if so, they will provide biographical information that will be made available on the synod website in April.

At the start of Synod Assembly on June 6, 2024, the names of these pre-identified persons will be included on the first ballot for the bishop election, along with the opportunity for an alternative candidate's name to be written in. The remainder of the election process will follow the guidelines outlined in our synod constitution, which may be found on the synod website <u>here</u>.


